Mayor and Town Board

The Eaton Mayor and Town Board oversee the actions of the Town by studying town issues, making decisions, and working with staff to direct the future of the community. The Eaton Town Board is composed of six board members who are elected at-large on a non-partisan basis for a term of four years along with a Mayor who is elected at-large and for a four-year term. The Eaton Planning and Zoning Commission is responsible for implementing the provisions of the town ordinances regarding zoning and land use, making recommendations to the town board regarding new annexations and variances, recommending changes to the zoning maps, and making updates to the Town's Comprehensive Plan.
